We proved that St. Mary's Episcopal Cathedral is alive and well — certainly willing and more than able to dream big and to accomplish even more. Below is a quick summary of the events, and the numbers, of Martyrs' Weekend:



On **Martyrs' Weekend** we welcomed **hundreds** of parishioners, guests, and neighbors to a variety of events:

- Hope & Food on Saturday morning
  - Morning Prayer (48 attending)
  - Brownbag Breakfast (115 receiving)
  - plus a Health Fair!
- \* Celebration of Remembrance & Renewal
  - ❖ At least **375** attending Saturday evening
  - Banners in procession from throughout the Diocese
  - ❖ At least **40** choristers joined the St. Mary's Choir
  - plus we raised nearly \$5,000 to support affiliated ministries!
- Remembering Constance and her Companions
  - ❖ Over **100** joined us for Holy Eucharist on Sunday
  - Over 80 attended the Picnic at Elmwood Cemetery

**God's blessings** abound here at St. Mary's. As the psalmist once wrote, truly our "cup runneth over." How we shall we respond to such abundance?

**My giving** recognizes that God has blessed me deeply and profoundly in so many ways in my service as your Interim Dean, a position which has brought me both challenge and deep joy.

**I give** not only because of my gratitude for God's abundance but also because it is God's call for me to support the work of the church in all the ways I can. We are all called to love both God and neighbor; our church provides an excellent opportunity for doing both.

For 2023, the Cathedral adopted a budget of just over \$560,000 in expenses — but only \$503,000 in income. This deficit spending is not only unsustainable but also fails to acknowledge the abundance of God's blessings in our life. I invite you to consider anew how you can respond to God's many blessings, and how you can share even more fully in the life and ministries of this, your great Cathedral.





You will note that our Pledge Card has two sides. One side is for noting your financial commitment — information the Mission Council relies on in preparing a responsible budget. The other side lists ministry opportunities—additional ways you can support our common shared ministries here.
